

Lambros Varelas was born in 1968 in Vathirema, Trikala (Thessaly, Greece). He got his BA degree in Modern Greek Literature, Aristotle University, Thessaloniki. He also got his MA and PhD on literary and intellectual movements in the Greek province during the interwar period at the same school. He has taught at private Secondary Schools; in 2001 he was appointed a researcher on Modern Greek Literature at the Centre for the Greek Language (Thessaloniki). He has also been working as a tutor of Modern Greek Literature at the Hellenic Open University since 2002. He is elected and is to be appointed an assistant professor at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (School of Philology). His research interests include 19th century Modern Greek literature, literary texts in education and literary magazines. He is the editor of the index of the periodical *Greek Letters* (1927-1930) (University Studio Press 1995), the Marinos Papadopoulos Vretos's narratives (Nefeli 2004) as well as the volume *Modern Greek Literature and Translated Texts in Greek Secondary Education (1884-2001): A Brief Historical Review and Indexing of Textbooks* (Centre for the Greek Language 2007). A number of research papers of his have been published both in various reviews and in books of proceedings of conferences.
